
Figure 1. The Three Surfaces of the Structural Analysis of Social Behavior

Figure 1. Structural Analysis of Social Behavior (SASB; Benjamin, 1974). This figure is the two-word version of SASB that appeared in Benjamin (1987), using single words from the one-word version in Benjamin (1996/2003) instead of the two words in Benjamin (1987). In all versions of SASB, the 3 surfaces represent 3 types of focus (other, self, introject). Within each focus, vertical axes describe interdependence; and horizontal axes describe affiliation.
